ISW (Indigenous Support Worker) Corner

My Name is Warren Washburn, I'm the ISW of Lakedell, Falun and PLRS schools for WRPS. We are grateful for the opportunity to support our indigenous students in each of the schools. We work on being proud of who we are as indigenous people, and how we can best walk together through the path to education.



We were honored to have an elder of Pigeon lake come and do a pipe ceremony for our schools. A pipe ceremony is a way to add a positive to the beginning of our school year through prayer. The elder requested that we provide print, so our prayers of a safe and caring school. The elder instructed that each school hang these prints on the south wall of the school for safety.

We are in the process of educating the students in Falun and Lakedell on the importance of Pow wow through an indigenous lens. This is a way to stay connected as a community and share our indigenous way of life. Our indigenous students feel proud and connected in the class, and will share that they dance or they have family that dance. We do have a part of our celebration called Intertribal where we all, indigenous and non indigenous can come together and celebrate with dance.

These are some of the vocabulary we are working on:

- 1. Regalia (The outfit the dancer are wearing is call a Regalia)
- 2. Pow Wow (A celebration, a time to bring people together)
- 3. Sacred (Meaning that the Regalia is sacred to the dancers)
- 4. Intertribal (This is when our indigenous and non indigenous attendees can share in dance)
- 5. Drums (The instrument used in a pow wow)
- 6. Tobacco (Protocol)
- 7. Grand Entry (The beginning of our celebration, all the dancers enter together)
- 8. Feast (A time we invite our people that have passed, to come eat with us through feast)

These Pow wows that go on in our neighboring communities (Maskwacis). Our children might have the opportunity to attend in the future. They will understand what goes on and they might educate others about pow wow.
